Max Planck Institute hosts competition policy workshop

The Max Planck Institute for Intellectual Property, Competition and Tax Law hosted a workshop on "Regional Integration and Competition Policy in Developing Countries" last July in Frauenchiemsee, Bavaria, Germany.

Atty. Anthony Abad, Managing Director of TA Trade Advisory Group and a professor at the Ateneo de Manila University Law School's Center for International Economic Law (CIEL), was invited to discuss competition policy in the ASEAN as part of the workshop's session on Latin America and Southeast Asia.

The workshop was a three-day event focusing on the analyses of regional competition laws and policies in developing nations, including the economic, political and development aspects of the regionalization of these policies.
